

IN response to a need long felt, the congregation of Blantyre Parish Church have decided upon the erection of Parish Church Halls. Our object is to provide, not merely accommodation for the efficient discharge of our Church work in its various branches, but also the means of fostering those principles and tastes which will contribute to the welfare of the community.

Of our Church work nothing need be said, save that we have no hall whatever in which to carry it on. But we beg to state what is of more general interest — that, while our halls will be a public boon in suitably accommodating the many and various meetings which take place in the parish, we purpose, by means of a Library and Reading Room and Recreation Rooms, to endow the working men with the pleasures and advantages of literature, and of rightly toned and intelligent companionship.

According to estimates accepted, the cost of our venture will not exceed £1250. By private subscription among the heritors and congregation, we have already collected £750 ; and as an admirable site has been secured, the building will be proceeded with immediately. The remaining £500 we hope to raise by means of a Bazaar, to be held in the Town Hall, Hamilton. On Thursday, Friday, and Saturday, the 24th, 25th, and 26th days of March 1892.

On behalf of a scheme so commendable, we venture to make an earnest and confident appeal to all, both within and without the parish, who are interested in the progress of social and religious work. We are indeed well aware that there are many similar and equally interesting appeals, but we would give the assurance that donations, to whatever amount, either in the form of subscriptions or gifts of useful and artistic articles of every possible description, will be most acceptable.
